

PARSONS GETS NEW NOTE

Latest Kidnap Letter Chides Him for Informing Police

William H. Parsons, husband of Mrs. Alice Parsons, who disappeared from her home at Stony Brook, L. I., on June 9 and has been the object of an intensive search by State police and Federal investigators, has received another note relating to the kidnapping. This note, the eighth in the series received since the kidnapping, chided him for turning over the notes to authorities and again promised help in finding the body of Mrs. Parsons.

Receipt of the eighth note was told by Mrs. Anna Kupryanova-Parsons, the Russian-born woman who lived with the Parsons couple and who said she had changed her name legally to Parsons, in an interview published in an afternoon paper. It was confirmed by Benjamin Shiverts, attorney for Mrs. Kupryanova.

Mrs. Kupryanova criticized police activities in the case. She said that the work of the local authorities and Federal investigators did not appear to be coordinated, but at cross-purposes. She asserted that the investigators dismissed the first of these notes as simply another crank letter and did not give it the attention it deserved.
