According to Anna Mr. Parsons is a very peculiar person and does not like people and cannot get along with people and is highly temperamental. He is not liked in the community where he lives and very seldom permits anyone to visit his house and only on rare occasions visits anyone else's which is quite the opposite of Mrs. Parsons.

Anna emphatically denied that she was at any time intimate with Parsons or that he ever made any attempts to be intimate. This fact was later disproved and their admissions relative to their illicit relationship which existed for a number of years were obtained. Likewise, the extensive use of contraceptives was determined upon an examination of the cess-pools on the Parsons' farm, it being evident that inasmuch as Mrs. Parsons was desirous of having a child that Mr. Parsons would probably not employ such means in his normal relations with his wife.

Anna Kupryanova was interviewed on several occasions by Special Agent L. G. Turrou in her native Russian language and it was determined that she is not connected with any former nobility or aristocracy of Russia by blood or marriage, although she asserted on numerous occasions that her father was a "Dvorianin," a hereditary designation known as that of the privileged class of people. It was also observed that she does not speak Russian as a woman of education should. During the course of the interview in Russian, she made a number of inexcusable grammatical errors and it is doubtful whether Anna Kupryanova ever was graduated from a secondary school in Russia as claimed by her. She is characterized as more of a peasant type than any other. Her wanderings abroad since the Russian Revolution and her varied experiences have naturally plished her, thus enabling her to impress people as being of the better education and breeding than the average Russian woman of the middle class.

In connection with the wearing apparel of victim, her aunt, Miss Bess Williams, indicated that some time ago she made some nightgowns for Alice Parsons and that in checking through the effects of Alice at the house she was unable to find one particular nightgown which she recalls definitely making for Alice.
